autier is located on the west bank of the Pascagoula River Jopposite the city of Pascagoula. It is named for Ferdinand Gautier who homesteaded in the area in 1867. Today that home, known as "The Old Place", still stands and is the site of many public and private events. Fernando Gautier established a sawmill alongside the railroad in Gautier and thus the town grew in population. With the outbreak of World War II, Gautier again experienced another growth spurt as people arrived to work at nearby Ingalls Shipyard. In 1986, Gautier incorporated and adopted a council-manager style of government. Gautier is the site of the Jackson County campus of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College. With over seventy miles of waterfront within the city limits and two excellent golf courses, Gautier offers abundant recreational opportunities for families and retirees alike. In fact, in 2009, Gautier was named by US News and World Report as one of the best places to retire in the USA.
