2013 COMMUNITY OVERVIEW: City of Gulfport

Provided by Gulf Regional Planning Commission for use by community members, visitors, agencies and organizations living in or moving to the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

ulfport is the second largest city in Mississippi, after the state Jeapital, Jackson. Gulfport began as a lumber town, but, with the development of the harbor and the addition of the north-south rail lines, it quickly became and remains a hub for goods movement. Since its incorporation in 1898, the city has flourished. The Port of Gulfport is the official state port and the second largest importer of green fruit in the USA. Currently, the port is enlarging to accommodate anticipated increased traffic due to the Panama Canal expansion. Downtown Gulfport has blossomed since Hurricane Katrina, with many commercial buildings benefiting from the "historic façade" grant program. Currently, eighteen restaurants are located downtown. Gulfport is home to military installations of the US Navy, US Coast Guard, US Air Force and Army National Guard. It is also the site of the Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport. Despite its commercial significance, its tourism role is not to be forgotten. Gulfport is home to a casino resort and has an impressive and pristine sand beach.
