2013 COUNTY OVERVIEW: Hancock County

Provided by Gulf Regional Planning Commission for use by community members, visitors, agencies and organizations living on or moving to the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

Hancock County was incorporated in 1812. In its early days it was sparsely settled, mostly along the water. Northerners became familiar with the area during the Civil War and afterwards began to flock to the beaches, helping to promote the area as a resort.

In 1963, our next claim to fame, the Stennis Space Center was created, allowing NASA to test rocket engines. Both private companies and public agencies, including the Navy's Meteorology and Oceanography Command, flocked to the area creating a concentration of research and technology. Today Stennis is the largest employment site in the county. In 1992, the state legislature allowed casino gambling on the coast, and Hancock is currently the site of two casinos. In 2005, Hurricane Katrina devastated Hancock County, but today, most of the reconstruction has been completed, including a new, wider Beach Boulevard which has been declared a "scenic byway". Nine miles of broad sidewalks facilitate walking along the sand beach, and bikers can use a 5-mile trail.

In April 2012, a fabulous new attraction, Infinity Science Center, opened to educate and entertain thousands of people from near and far. Hancock County is home to the cities of Bay St. Louis, Diamondhead and Waveland and includes the census designated places of Pearlington and Kiln.

PORT BIENVILLE INDUSTRIAL PARK STENNIS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT & AIRPARK

by the Hancock County Development Commission. Port Bienville Industrial Park houses close to 20 companies, with over 1000 employees, in industries ranging from chemical manufacturing to warehousing. The Port connects to the Intracoastal Waterway and operates a shortline railroad which in turn connects to CSX rail lines.
