Mississippi's Flagship City, Pascagoula is the home of Huntington Ingalls Shipbuilding, the state's largest employer. Other major manufacturers include the Chevron Oil Refinery, Signal International and VT Halter Marine. The Port of Pascagoula ranks in the nation's top 20 for its volume of foreign cargo.

Pascagoula is named for the peaceful native tribe who lived in the area when it was explored in the 1540's by DeSoto. A Spanish territory until 1798, Pascagoula was incorporated in 1838 and again in 1904 when it took in the village of Scranton. The 8th largest city in Mississippi, Pascagoula is the County Seat for Jackson County. In 1965, the city began operating under a Council-Manager form of government. Recently Pascagoula has embarked upon a major upgrade of its riverfront with plans for an environmental trail with vistas for hikers and joggers and a promenade, park, and marina along its Mississippi Sound beachfront


